III. PLAN OF EXAMINATION

District Board of Ministry (Studies)

Those individuals in the course of study are under the direction of the District Board of Ministry. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS Eligibility

The board serves only those who are properly enrolled. Enrollment is open to local ministers and district licensed ministers. If you qualify and wish to be enrolled, request your pastor to write a letter to the board chairman. The letter should request your enrollment, stating the date and action of the local church board, your name, address, and phone number and indicate whether you plan to pursue ordination as an elder or a deacon.

Courses

There are two ministerial courses administered by the Ministerial Studies Board: elder and deacon.

Ministers will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses.

Modes of Study

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a Nazarene liberal arts college/university, and if possible, Nazarene Theological Seminary. Other modes include attending Nazarene Bible College, or obtaining a degree at Nazarene Bible College through their online Module Plus program and the Northwest Nazarene University online program. In these programs a certificate can be earned that fulfills ordination study requirements. In special circumstances the Board Chairman and Board Secretary have the right to set up a program for those who cannot complete the courses through the degree or online programs.

Studies Regulations for Online Students

- 1. Students should be prepared to appear for interview as called upon by the Ministerial Studies Board at the annual renewal time for district license, or application for first district license.
- 2. Two subject courses completed per year is the basic minimum goal for continuing in the course of study (see *Manual 527.4*). Candidates who fail to meet this goal may be dropped from the course of study if the Studies Board feels a student is not putting forth reasonable effort.
- 3. All course work must be credited by April 30 in order to be guaranteed of applying for the current assembly year. Work filed thereafter will apply on the following year. Exceptions to this will be in the case of a student who will complete course work, and can get a transcript record to the Ministerial Studies Secretary five days preceding the day the Ministerial Studies Board will convene for their annual meeting.

4. Students should familiarize themselves with sections 527.1-6 of the Manual.

College Students

All college students desiring to enter full-time ministry and pursue ordination should enroll with the District Board of Ministerial Studies. Graduation from college or university is no guarantee that the education requirements as set forth in the Manual have been met for ordination.

College students are responsible to submit to the board documentary (transcript) evidence of course work completed. Such evidence must be submitted to the board secretary each year following the spring semester. Failure to submit a transcript may indicate a failure on the part of the student to meet the educational requirements and subject the student to the possibility of being dropped from enrollment in the course of studies.

College students are reminded to plan their curriculum in concurrence with the Studies Board advice. The final transcript of graduation will be evaluated by the District Ministerial Studies Board and no requirements stated in the Manual will be waived.

- 3. Enrollment requires combined approval of the district superintendent and Ministerial Studies Board chairman and secretary.
- 4. The secretary will then fill out an official enrollment form and mail a copy to the student.

IV. DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Sunday, July 10, 2016 Opening Rally and Report of the District Superintendent

The elected delegates and Nazarenes from across the Kansas District gathered at the Wichita First Church of the Nazarene at 6:30 p.m. for the opening rally of the 107th District Assembly of the Kansas District Church of the Nazarene.

Rev. Bond welcomed guests: General Superintendent Dr. David and Mrs. Graves; General Superintendent Emeritus Dr. Jim and Mrs. Bond, Rev. Dan and Debbie Braaten, and Rev. Paul and Angie Mienke. He then welcomed Kevin Borger, representative from MidAmerica Nazarene University, and the musical group from MNU.

Dr. Brent Van Hook, host pastor, brought greetings from Wichita First Church and then prayed the offertory prayer. The MNU students provided the music for the offertory.

General Superintendent Dr. J.W. Warrick introduced Rev. Jim C. Bond for his second report as the District Superintendent of the Kansas District. (See the full text of Rev. Bond's report in the "Report" section V of this journal.)

Monday, July 11, 2016 Monday Evening Service

After a prelude of great music provided by MNU singing groups, Rev. Jim Bond welcomed everyone to the evening service. Tim Pitzer led the congregation in a magnificent time of worship in song. Presiding General Superintendent Dr. J.K. Warrick brought a powerful and convicting message from Luke 24. At the conclusion of his message and prayed for a fresh anointing for pastors and the entire Kansas District.

Tuesday, July 12, 2016 Tuesday Morning Session

The 107th Assembly of the Kansas District Church of the Nazarene convened at Wichita First Church, July 12, 2016 for the Tuesday morning business session. A Voices of Praise from MidAmerica Nazarene University provided special music as the delegates assembled. The District Assembly was called to order at 8:30 a.m. by Dr. JK Warrick, presiding General Superintendent. He welcomed the delegates and friends of the Kansas District to the assembly. Dr. Warrick also extended special greetings to Dr. Nash and other special guests.

Dr. Warrick brought the morning message from John 4. He challenged the delegates to see the harvest in their communities and reach out to the lost. Dr. Warrick closed his message with prayer.

Nate Brinar-Hutchinson First (Sports & Outreach), Rev. Dustin Bowerly-Hutchinson First (Worship & Arts). The delegation expressed their appreciation and welcomed these new members to the Kansas District team.

The assembly voted to receive these reports and accept these names as those appearing on the ballots. Board of Tellers #1 was called to distribute ballot #1. The delegates cast their votes and the board of tellers collected the ballots.

Dr. Warrick directed the delegates to the Church Growth and Evangelism Committee Report. He encouraged the delegates to read and apply the recommendations in this report. The delegation voted to receive this report.

The Chair then directed the assembly to review the Education Committee report. It was moved and seconded to receive this report. The assembly voted to approve the report.

The Chair then directed the assembly to review the Ministerial Support and Benevolence report. The importance of the Pastoral Sabbatical Policy (Item #11) was stressed. It was moved and seconded to receive this report. The assembly voted to approve the report.

Board of Tellers #2 was called to distribute the ballots for General Assembly Delegates. The delegates marked the ballots and the Board of Tellers #2

collected the ballots.

Dr. Warrick asked Rev. Dennis Welch to escort Donna Bond to the platform. The delegates greeted Mrs. Bond and appreciation. Mrs. Bond shared her love and appreciation for the people of Kansas. These were echoed by Pastor Bond. Rev. Andy Heer presented the Bonds with a love offering from the churches on the Kansas District.

Dr. Warrick presented Pastor Bond for an extended call as Kansas District Superintendent. Dr. Warrick prayed and asked Board of Tellers #1 to distribute a ballot with a Yes/No vote to extend Pastor Bond's call to serve as District Superintendent. Board of Tellers #1 excused to count the ballots.

The chair directed the delegates to the Christian Action Committee Report. A question was raised in regards to the New Creation Ministries. Director Clint Price has passed away and it is unclear if the ministry is still active. The delegation voted to receive this report.

Board of Tellers #1 and Board of Tellers #2 were excused to count the ballots for District Board positions and General Assembly delegates.

Dr. Warrick presented the General Superintendent's Award to Rev. Kevin McDonald and the Junction City Church.

Rev. Dan Braaten gave his report as Kansas Church Planting and Revitalization coordinator.

Rev. Luis Quinonez gave his report as Kansas Hispanic Work Coordinator

District Secretary, Rev. Jay Bessmer shared announcements, closing the morning session. Pastor Bond dismissed the delegation for lunch with a prayer and instructions to return at 1:30 pm to resume business.

Tuesday July 12, 2016 Afternoon Session

Rev. Bond called the assembly back to order. The report of Ballot #1 was presented to the assembly. It consisted of the following results:

Dr. Warrick recognized and thanked the chaplains and evangelists for their service.

Dr. Warrick asked for a motion to close the 107th Kansas District Assembly following the Ordination Service at 7:00 pm tonight, July 12, 2016. Motion received and seconded. Motion approved. The session was closed in prayer.

Tuesday, July 12, 2016 Ordination Service

Rev. Jim C. Bond, District Superintendent, welcomed everyone to the ordination service. The congregation sang a hymn ked by Tim Pitzer. The offering was taken as the MNU vocal team sang for the offertory.

The following elders were granted retired status: Charles West (will be officially granted in 2017) and received a plaque by Dr. Warrick and Rev. Bond.

Kansas District Assembly Report/Charge

Greetings, Delegates and friends of the Kansas district, welcome to our 107th District Assembly. This is my second report to you and I am especially pleased to welcome our distinguished guests, Dr. JK Warrick, our presiding General Superintendent and his wife Patty. To all our Kansas District pastors, staff and spouses, lay delegates, and friends of the Kansas District, we say welcome! I want to recognize my wife, Donna, who is my best friend and co-laborer in this work on the Kansas District. I would also like to recognize my parents, Dr. and Mrs. Jim Bond.

There is power in a seed! This evening, I invite you to meditate on the power of a seed!

Luke 13:18-19: Then Jesus asked, "What is the kingdom of God like? What shall I compare it to? It is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his garden. It grew and became a tree, and the birds perched in its branches."

Alan Hirsch writes, in his book, Permanent Revolution, "as every seed has the full potential for a tree and the tree the full potential of the forest, so too every church (indeed every believer) has the full potential of a movement in it..."Every believer is a church planter, and every church is a churchplanting church." Every believer has ecclesia (church) in him or her, and every ecclesia is responsible for the reproduction of others."

As I have thought about and prayed for our short time together as we gather here in Wichita for this District Assembly, I want to accomplish two goals. First, I want to recognize the good year that we have had as we have worked together in the Master's Vineyard. Secondly, I want to continue to set vision for us as the Kansas District.

So let's jump right in! Last year, you will remember that our theme was "Harvest". I challenged us to think about the "Nones"— 50 percent of the people living in Kansas claim no religious affiliation. They drive past our churches everyday and never darken the doors. I challenged us to pray together through the 10:02 prayer: for God to send his workers into the harvest field. I challenged us to think about having conversations and developing friendships with those who do not go to church with us. I challenged us to plant churches. I believe God would be pleased if we would double the number of our churches in the next 10 years. Our vision is to plant 70 multiplying churches.

So how did we do?

Well I am pleased to report that we have done well in most measureable categories.

We have one church that will receive the General Superintendents' Award this year at assembly: Kevin McDonald and Junction City First Church of the Nazarene!

We've had a good year! But let's continue now to look to the future! The second goal I have tonight is to remind you of what I think God is asking us to do. Our vision is to plant 70 reproducing churches in the next 10 years. Well, we now have 9 years.

Farming 101: No Planting, No Harvest. Last year I got a little ahead of myself with the theme of Harvest. Many years ago, I learned that if you want a great harvest, you have to plant.

When I was a potato farmer in the San Luis Valley, we knew this. We worked tirelessly preparing the seed in late February and March, making sure it was ready to be planted. We plowed the ground, finished picking the rocks out, made the seed bed, planted the seed, fertilized, cultivated and made sure the irrigation was right all summer long! We were hoping for a bountiful harvest.

Jesus says it this way: John 12:24: "Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds."

Mark 4: 26: He also said, "This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man scatters seed on the ground. Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. All by itself the soil produces grain—first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head. As soon as the grain is ripe, he puts the sickle to it, because the harvest has come."

Are we scattering the seed?

- Are we praying Luke 10:2?
- Are we looking for opportunities for conversations and relationships?
- Are we discipling others?
- Are we planting churches and new works?
- Are we thinking about the generations behind us?

We have been busy this year in God's harvest field, planting TEN new works on the Kansas District!

Church planting and starting new works beyond the walls of the church is the best way to reach lost and broken people.

I would like for Dan Braaten to share with us a little about church planting and revitalization.

There is power in a seed. We must plant seeds, lots and lots of seeds: New churches, new works, looking for new friends, conversations with neighbors, and people at our school and at our workplace. I believe if you are a Spirit-filled follower of Jesus Christ, you can't help yourself. You will plant seeds of the gospel.

It is amazing what God is doing through church planting on our district. When we hit our knees and ask God to give us a vision to reach our community for him, He will answer. God is giving churches on our district fresh vision. When we take that God-vision and step out in faith, God can work and move.

Junction City Nazarene believes God wants them to plant multiple churches. It's His vision. They have stepped out in faith, beyond what they can do in their own strength and resources. Guess what? God shows up.

They had a vision to plant a church in Chapman, Kansas. They had developed a launch team and were praying regularly for God to provide what was needed to plant a church. They were prayer walking through the streets asking God to provide a place to meet. The next week they heard through Facebook that the Lutheran church was closing and their building was for sale. The church was taking sealed bids and the deadline was two weeks away. Kevin called me and asked about buying the church. My immediate thought was: "Whoa! Wait a minute! We haven't even met for one service. We don't have a church yet. We can't okay borrowing money to buy a church if we don't even have a church yet."

He said, "We want to make an offer. We want to make and offer of 10% of the tithes and offerings going to the Lutheran charities for the next 3 years." I thought, "Well, we don't have to borrow money. Go for it!" He took it to the board the next night they voted to proceed and raised \$50,000 in the board meeting that night for the down payment. They talked to the church body the next Sunday and they raised another \$27,000. So they made their bid a week later. It was a total of \$77,000 down and 10% of the tithes and giving to the Lutheran charities for the next three years. I should also tell you that the church was replaced a few years ago after the Chapman tornado leveled the old church. It is a beautiful facility that sits across the parking lot of the local high school. Its value is 1.2 to 1.3 million dollars.

The next week they opened the bids. The Lutheran elder opening the bids said there were three bids. JCNaz's bid was the lowest bid, by far. She was a little disappointed, but as she was laying the bid aside, she said, "she felt the hand of the Lord on her back". The Holy Spirit said to her, "This is the bid you need to accept." They accepted the bid and we launched the Chapman Nazarene church on Easter Sunday! They have average around 150 in worship attendance since.

God is in church planting and reaching lost and broken people. Let's dare to dream. Let's step out in faith. Let's plant churches. There is power in a seed!

Some people might question the call to church planting. Does Jesus command us to plant churches, and if so where? Allen Hirsch writes in Permanent Revolution: "The term church planting itself is problematic. That is partly because we are never actually commanded to plant churches. In the Bible that is always considered to be Jesus' job; for our part, we are called to evangelize the world by making disciples. (Matthew 28:18-20)

"Our ultimate goal is not church planting but "gospel planting." This fulfills Jesus' Great Commission: "to make Christ-like disciples."

Don't just sit on the sidelines and do nothing! Get out there and change a life.

There is power in the seed. We must plant seeds, lots and lots of seeds: New churches, new works, looking for new friends, conversations with neighbors, and people at our school and at our workplace. I believe if you are a Spirit-filled follower of Jesus Christ, you can't help yourself. You will plant seeds of the gospel.

Jesus said in Acts 1:8: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth."

If we are filled with the Spirit, we have the power -- the Power of the Gospel! The Power of the Seed!

God intended His Church to be like a starfish and not so much like a spider!

"In terms of organizations, a spider and a starfish might look the same, but their organization is worlds apart. A spider that loses a leg might well be able to function. It might even be able to operate minus three legs, although its survival would be endangered if it lost four. However, it will die if it loses its head, because its central nervous system is located there. The starfish is a different animal altogether. Cut a leg off a starfish, and it grows back, and the leg that was cut off will actually grow into another starfish. Cut the starfish into ten pieces, and you end up with ten starfish. In other words, every element in its system has the full capacity to reproduce itself. If one observes what is going on in the book of Acts, one can easily discern that New Testament ecclesiology is more like the starfish than the spider."

It's a little scary to give power away, to decentralize. In the church, we like the spider more than the starfish. We like to control. But God's church is like wind. We can't control it. We have to equip, trust and empower others to spread seeds of the gospel. One thought that keeps me awake at night is when I envision what the Kansas district will look like in ten years, twenty years, and thirty years. We need to always be thinking about the next generation and empowering them to be the church. Are we thinking about the next generation?

Cimarron was my first church. We were trying to do some new things. This was back in the 90's. We started a worship band on Sunday morning. There were drums in the sanctuary. Jerry Burns stepped alongside of me one morning. I will never forget it. He said, "Pastor, we have some drums in the worship service and you may hear that some people are a little upset. I really don't like the drums that much myself. But pastor, my grandkids like to worship with those drums. And as long as my grandkids are coming to church and worshipping, you keep right on using those drums. I'll do my part to support behind the scenes and smooth the waters."

You know what that was? That was a seed willing to die. A seed willing to sacrifice his preferences, a seed willing to go and do whatever it takes to reach someone for the Gospel.

CB Jernigan our 1st District Superintendent said, "Oh, brother, let us return to pioneers days and ways, and go to places where they do not want us, and stay until they think they cannot get along without us, and plant things for God. There is plenty of room 'out under the stars'. Do not wait for a call, God gave you that."

It's been an awesome first year serving on the Kansas District. I've enjoyed working under the leadership of our DS Jim Bond, with Luis Quinonez, Angie Meinke, and all the great pastors and churches across our district.

We have now launched eight new churches or works, and have eight more getting ready to launch in the next church year. A huge shout out to our sponsoring churches which include Manhattan, Hutchinson Bethany, Salina First, Junction City, Pratt and Wichita First. Church planting is the most effective way to reach the unchurched, and churches starting churches is the most effective way to plant new churches.

We now have new churches and works in coffee shops, on college campus, in former empty church facilities, and in our existing churches. God is on the move and many of our new churches will not look and function like churches in the past. They will however be sharing the same Gospel that lost and broken people need in our world.

We have assessed 12 potential church planters and continue the recruiting process with several future church planters. We have done several DCPI training events this past year, and have scheduled a DCPI training event February 7-9, 2016 in Garden City. We will be doing the New Church Dynamics and Church Planting Essentials tracks. We are also planning a DCPI Church Planting Essentials training in Wichita this summer. The dates will be released soon.

We have walked with the Larned Church through a restart process, and Pastor Daryl and Cheri Riffel have done an incredible work in bringing new beginnings to this community and church! We are also working through a yearlong revitalization process with nine churches on the district. We are excited to see what God will do through these churches as they seek fresh vision for their communities.

God is on the move across the Kansas District!!!

Revelation 3(NIV) To the Church in Sardis: "To the angel of the church in Sardis write: These are the words of him who holds the seven spirits of God and the seven stars. I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead. 2 Wake up! Strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have found your deeds unfinished in the sight of my God. 3 Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; hold it fast, and repent. But if you do not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what time I will come to you.

4 Yet you have a few people in Sardis who have not soiled their clothes. They will walk with me, dressed in white, for they are worthy. 5 The one who is victorious will, like them, be dressed in white. I will never blot out the name of that person from the book of life, but will acknowledge that name before my Father and his angels. 6 Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches.

People of God – do you ever get a since of desperation, a near panic feeling, that time is short, and whatever we are going to do for God must be done soon, that we should get to work NOW – because night time is coming when no man can work?

Do you remember the scene in the Wizard of Oz, when Dorothy, the Tin man, the Lion and the Scare crow were within eyesight of the Emerald City, so with their goal in sight they began to run toward it, only to have the wicked witch cast a spell of sleepiness on them. In spite of being so close to their goal they fell asleep - if that isn't a fine picture of the church today!

Yet God's word would shout to us, "Wake up! Strengthen what remains and is about to die..."

This year, with this admonition from Gods word, we will focus on strengthening our churches!

As your district president, I don't ever want to fail to recognize and applaud the ministry that takes place week in and week out in our local churches and communities. We would like to thank our volunteer youth sponsors and senior pastors who are here today. Your support of the district NYI and your involvement with your students has not gone unnoticed! Thank you for sacrificially giving of your time and energy to build relationships with students and show them the love of Christ. If you are here today as a volunteer youth leader or as a senior pastor, would you please stand and allow us as students and district leaders to thank you? You may be seated.

Students, we know that God has blessed us with loving and caring local and district leaders. I encourage you to tell them how much you appreciate them. Here's an idea, the next time you stop by Sonic for happy hour, Quick Trip for a huge fountain drink, Starbucks for a skinny mocha latte w/ 3 shots or McAllister's for some amazing sweet tea – ask your youth leader or pastor what they want to drink & say, "I'm payin'" cuz you know you owe them. Big Time! You can even send them a nice little note through one of our helpful pages?

On a personal note, it's still an awesome pleasure to minister and serve alongside the people of Newton First. I appreciate the flexibility afforded me to serve in this role. I thank the Lord for blessing me with a loving family. I thank Lori, Lydia & Madlyn for putting up with me and Jordan and Andrew for coming home occasionally even if it's mostly for mom's cooking and to get your laundry done for free.

Ok, now let's take a quick look back at this past year. In cooperation with our district NMI, we challenged ourselves to raise funds for water wells in Africa & to help buy more motorcycles for pastors in Nepal who serve their communities and were in desperate need of transportation. Our goal again this year for the combined projects was \$8,000. Unfortunately, we've fallen quite short of our goal and to date have raised about \$2,000. Most of this

came in a couple of larger donations. The following churches have participated so far: Haysville, Hutch New Life, Lyons, Newton First, Severy, Wellington, and Wichita First. We thank these churches for participating. It's not too late if your church wants to join us and help us reach our goal!

We have set two NYI / NMI team projects for this new year. Our first project is an opportunity to help fund ministry efforts to join in the global fight against human trafficking. I'm sure we're all aware that human trafficking is more than just a problem in some distant country half-way around the world. Trafficking, a modern form of slavery, is a global crisis found even in Kansas and Oklahoma that abducts and enslaves people against their will. Giving assistance to fight trafficking and lending aid to those who've been rescued is a very worthwile cause. We have set our district goal for this project at \$4,000.

Additionally, we are challenging ourselves to match the funds we raise for human trafficking in order to send much needed funds to Nazarene Compassionate Ministries for Nazarene Disaster Response relief efforts. When natural disasters like hurricanes, tornadoes, floods or earthquakes occur NDR steps in to assist churches in the US & Canada respond to the needs in their communities. We can't all go to the areas that have been hit by disaster but we can all give to help NDR provide the necessities of food, water, and shelter for victims of the disasters.

We're asking local NYIs to set \$10 per student as a "starting" goal. So, if you have a youth group of 20 students, that's a combined starting goal of \$200. If your group has 10 students, your starting goal would be \$100. However, we know that many groups could easily raise more than the starting goal. For instance, if your starting goal is \$200, why not challenge yourself to raise \$250 or \$300 or more? One of our NYI's this year, with a group of about 25 students donated \$500. There are lots of creative ways to raise the funds. Let's challenge and commit our groups to doing our part to be a blessing to these valuable ministries.

Continuing our review of this past year, for several hot days last July, a bunch of middle school students, sponsors, and staff met for another awesome time at Wheat State Camp. We were challenged by several of our district leaders to "Catch Fire" for Christ and live out our faith boldly in a world that is increasingly hostile to the message of Christ. Many students accepted the challenges and committed themselves to a deeper walk with Christ.

In the fall, our Bible quizzers began a 9 month study of several of the Apostle Paul's letters. A few of our quizzers focused on Bible memorization and memorized near perfectly almost 90 passages of Scripture! Lock-In was a great opportunity last November for several hundred of us to meet here in Wichita for an evening of worship & a night of fun. We enjoyed reconnecting with people we hadn't seen since summer.

In the spring, we met in Hutch and Nickerson to worship together again & display our God-given talents through quizzing, fine arts, and athletics. Then, a few weeks later, we took our talents to MidAmerica Extreme and not only did we compete well, we demonstrated just how talented the students of the Kansas district are across the board. Once again, most importantly, we represented Christ well in winning and in losing.

Can you believe it's been over a month since we got back from Sr. High Camp at Camp Table Rock? What an amazing experience that was. During the evening messages and the morning seminars we were challenged to be godly leaders. I hope you're continuing to pray that God would prepare you to lead others by your godly example. Later, we'll watch a video reminder of the weekend.

Throughout the year, in addition to the district & field events, local NYI's have continued to meet and minister to students. As District President, it's my privilege to take a few moments during my report each year to try & recognize the ministry efforts that have taken place in our local NYI's in the past year. When I call your church's name, would a delegate from your youth group come & and receive the certificate(s) that we have for you?

I congratulate the students & leaders of each of these local youth ministries on being recognized & thank them for their ministry to youth in their community. These certificates do not adequately express our appreciation for all your commitment & efforts this past year.

God has continued to bless us as a district and as local NYI's. In the coming weeks and months, pray for our students as they head back to college, high school, & middle school. Pray that God's Spirit of revival would sweep across our campuses. Pray that our students would be godly examples and would boldy share the Gospel of Christ. Pray that God would physically and spiritually protect in the face of persecution and temptation.

Finally, a challenge from God's Word. The story of the Parable of the Sower is found in three of the four gospels. We can read it in Matthew ch. 13, Mark ch. 4, or Luke ch. 8. In Matthew chapter 13, beginning with verse 1 we read, "That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat by the lake. 2 Such large crowds gathered around Him that He got into a boat and sat in it, while all the people stood on the shore. 3 Then He told them many things in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow his seed. 4 As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. 5 Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. 6 But, when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. 7 Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. 8 Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. 9 Whoever has ears, let them hear."

The disciples wanted to know what Jesus meant by this so when the crowd left, they asked Him. In Mark chapter 4 beginning with verse 13 we read His response: 13" Then Jesus said to them, "Don't you understand this parable? How then will you understand any parable? 14 The sower sows the word. 15 Some people are like seed along the path, where the word is sown. As soon as they hear it, Satan comes and takes away the word that was sown in them. 16 Others, like seed sown on rocky places, hear the word and at once receive it with joy. 17 But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word; they quickly fall away. 18 Still others, like seed sown among thorns, hear the word;

19 but the worries of this life, the deceitfulness of wealth and the desires for other things come in and choke the word, making it unfruitful. 20 Others, like seed sown on good soil, hear the word, accept it, and produce a crop some thirty, some sixty, some a hundred times what was sown."

In breaking down the parable, Jesus explains here that a "sower," someone who distributes or plants seeds, went out to sow seeds. The word "sower" is often translated in newer versions of the Bible to be "farmer." Though not a bad understanding of the word Jesus uses here, it doesn't help us with Jesus' intent. As we know, a farmer's vocation is a continuous cycle of soil preparation, planting, fertilizing, watering, treating of weeds, harvesting, threshing, & carrying crops to market. In the parable, Jesus isn't concerned with the many responsibilities of a farmer. Jesus is specifically directing our attention to the role of the distribution or planting of seeds. Not everyone can be a farmer, but ANYONE can cast some seed.

Jesus said that a sower, "went out to sow his seed." Then He explained that the "seed" is "the word of God." We should note a couple of things here. First, we see that an individual "a sower" went out sowing or sharing the word of God with the express purpose of casting seed and with the desired outcome of reaping a spiritual harvest. This person sowed or cast the word of God all around, not accidently but purposefully because he "went out to sow." This parable isn't about someone who unknowingly said the right thing or happened to mention Jesus' name & low and behold something good came of it. That's NOT sowing the word of God. This person intentionally shared "his seed" which Christ tells us was the "word of God." He faithfully did what he was supposed to do & he did it well.

Next, notice that the sower INTENTIONALLY scattered his seed EVERYWHERE -- on all types of places -- unlike a farmer who tries to plant only in the good soil. A farmer doesn't want to waste good seed and his valuable time on planting seeds in unproductive places. However, this sower isn't so cautious. In fact, I like to say that he sowed "indiscriminately" without regard for where the seed would land and FULLY aware of what he was doing. He faithfully & obediently sowed the word because he knew his responsibility was in the sowing. The seed quality, the soil condition, and the growing process were not his concern but rather they belonged to the Giver of the seed, the Maker of the soil & the Lord of the increase and harvest.

Remember, the word used here is "sower" not "farmer." This is NOT referring ONLY to individuals whose calling and vocation is that of pastors. All believers are to be "sowers" of God's word sharing it intentionally and indiscriminately while trusting God with the results. The Lord said in Isaiah 55:10 & 11, "For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish, and furnishing seed to the sower and bread to the eater; So will My word be which goes forth from My mouth; It will not return to Me empty, but will accomplish what I desire, and achieve the purpose for which I sent it." Believers, we MUST sow the word of God so that others can hear and respond. Someone shared the word of God with us, we must not fail to share it with others. We don't get a pass on this. Our sowing should be done thoughtfully and freely because it's our responsibility & also because we desire to see the word "achieve its desired purpose" in the lives of others, all the while with the confidence that God is responsible for the results.

In His explanation to the disciples, Jesus revealed that when the sower

faithfully sows the word of God and it lands on fertile soil that is ready to receive it, it WILL produce a crop. And not just some crop but often 30, 60 or 100 times what was sown! God's word sown on good soil has the power to spread and become more than a few plants, it has the ability to produce an entire crop ready for harvesting. When believers share God's word & it lands on the right soil the results are amazing. However, the sower doesn't get the credit. He was simply being faithful to cast seed & share the word of God wherever and with whomever, with no regard for the condition of the soil or where the seed landed. Many faithful sowers of God's word have been surprised by the crop yield when they sowed. As believers, when we sow God's word, we don't know the condition of the soil nor do we have any idea what will be the yield if the seed is sown on good soil. Can you imagine the crop that resulted from faithful sowers like the Apostle Paul, Martin Luther, John Wesley, D.L. Moody, Uncle Bud Robinson and others? What kind of fruitful crop is awaiting the faithful sharing of God's word by those of us here this morning?

Finally, a few words about the seed that we are to sow. As Jesus explained, the seed is the word of God. Paul wrote in Romans 10:17, "Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ." In 1 Corinthians 1:18 Paul wrote, "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." The word of God that brings hope, faith & salvation to lost souls with ready soil is the message of the cross. Only telling people that God loves them isn't sharing enough of God's word. They also need to hear the bad news regarding their sinful condition, how their sin offends a completely righteous God & how hopeless they are without His help. The Gospel, the message of God's gift of forgiveness through Christ becomes TRULY good news to individuals who realize their own desperate condition. We must faithfully and indiscriminately share the word of God -- giving them the "bad" news and the Good News and then trust the Lord to produce His harvest.

In closing, a few things to remember:

- The sowing of God's word is the privilege & responsibility of ALL believers, not just pastors. This isn't optional. We don't get a pass. We must be faithful.
- When we share God's word with people we don't know whether they are ready to receive it or not but we must sow it indiscriminately leaving the results to God.
- Once we share God's word, some individuals will not be ready to receive it, at least not yet. But we should not give up on them or assume they won't ever be ready.
- God's word is always powerful and effective and always accomplishes the purpose for which He sent it. When it is sown on the good soil of someone's life only God knows how much of crop He will produce and whether it might be a 30, 60 or 100 fold yield. Only HE deserves the glory and credit because He gives the seed & He makes it flourish.
- The word that saves is much more than a few positive comments offered to make people feel good about themselves and about a

loving God. The message that gives spiritual life MUST include the bad news about a person's sinful condition before a holy God. The GOOD NEWS isn't GOOD if we don't give the bad news too.

• If the Holy Spirit has spoken to you and convicted you of apathy towards sharing the word of God, please, do not ignore His voice. He wants you to respond.

If every believer that is a part of Kansas NYI would begin to faithfully sow the word of God, only the Lord knows what kind of a spiritual harvest we would have. Please pray for the harvest & pray for faithful sowers.

- Model excellence in every aspect of our service.
- Share the story of God's blessing through the Church of the Nazarene.
- Communicate how involvement transforms lives.
- Encourage, motivate, and inspire others to participate in missions.
- Be a global movement, keeping the I (international) in NMI

While attending a District Leadership conference in Orlando this winter, District Presidents from across the United States and Canada were challenged with the question: **Do we know why we do what we do?** Many times we tend to first think, 'We should do a missions project! What shall we do? Then, think how do we do it and even forget to ask, 'Why are we doing this great thing?' Instead, our challenge was to rethink our steps in missions and ministry.

First think: Why do we do what we do? To share Christ's story, to help transform lives.

Then: How we do we share Christ's story? Through Prayer, WEF, Alabaster, Children & Youth, LINKS

Lastly: What we do to share Christ's story? We mobilize the church

When we begin to look at the needs in our local churches and communities, our first step of action should be prayer, discernment and then action. The Lord opens doors all around us so that we can be His Light. He will show us His will, if we ask.

Over the past year, your District NMI council has met several times asking questions like, 'How can we support our churches and encourage them in Missions?' 'How can we connect with each other better?' 'How do we share Missions with our young people?' 'How do we encourage and teach our Hispanic churches about Missions?'

Though we didn't answer all of these questions, we did begin to answer some.

Knowing that technology is an everyday part of our lives and culture, with information available at the tip of our fingers, we developed a website for Kansas Missions. Today we are excited to tell you we are launching an updated website which can be found on our Kansas District website: **ksnazarene.org** Click on the Missions link.

Knowing that many of our young, and not so young, Nazarene's are on the web daily, with social media as a means to stay connected to the world. To support and encourage our District churches, we began a Facebook page. Our goal is to post 3 times a week with either scripture, missionary profile or Nazarene news. We currently have 185 'Likes' on our page. We can be found as '**kansasnmi**'. We are now on twitter as **@kansasNMI** Thank you Todd Hunter for your leadership in updating our technology connections.

Zone meetings were held last fall where I had the honor of traveling and meeting many of our local NMI presidents. Introducing the updated technology, what is required for reporting, and encouraging them to keep Missions in front of their church families.

Wanting to encourage our children in Missions, on February 12 & 13, we held our first ever Kansas District Children's Missions Retreat in Garden City. Forty-one children, grades 4th-6th pre-registered, showing up wideeyed and not sure about what they were getting into. After checking in, pictures were taken for passports, tickets were purchased and they waited for the bus to take them to the Garden City airport...where they were to catch their first flight. Upon arriving at the Garden City airport, Pastor Mark Hall, Kansas District Children's Director, discovered they were at the wrong airport. So, back on the bus to the church to catch a flight on **Air Naz**. Three flights were taken that night: first stop Africa, second stop Papua New Guinea and lastly, Mexico. Customs was a little challenging for some kids, but no one was stopped from entering the next country. Whew! Our goal was to show our kiddos what the Church of the Nazarene is doing globally by sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Ten adults and four teens helped pull off our first retreat, representing churches from Garden City, Hutch First, Wichita First, Udall, Hugoton, Cimarron, and Elkhart. We have two Children's Mission Retreats planned for this church year. You'll find the dates and locations in your booklet on page 34.

Our Council helped facilitate six missionary tours this past year: Stephane & Sandra Tibi, Lynn & Sherry Shmidt, Daniel Herrea, Don & Evie Gardner, Brandon & Caitlyn Doerksen, and Deanna. We've learned a lot over this past year on organizing and scheduling tours. Now having a year of experience, we are excited to promote five missionary couples coming to our District beginning next month through next summer. Thank you to Tim Bertrand and Lester Lever for your leadership. We are continually working to bring missionaries to our District. We will update when new opportunities arise.

The Church of the Nazarene is a global church with ministries that reach around the world with the love of Christ. Story after story is told about God's work in the lives of countless individuals and churches. As you give through donations to World Evangelism Fund, you are a part of these stories. Your giving goes toward spreading the gospel of Christ and making disciples around the world.

The World Evangelism Fund goes directly toward accomplishing the mission of the Church of the Nazarene, to make Christlike disciples in the nations. The World Evangelism Fund is the funding that operates the Church of the Nazarene and its entire mission effort, from the operation of the Global Ministry Center to districts and churches around the world.

The World Evangelism Fund is funded by churches giving 5.5%, or more, of their reported income with the largest portion going to mission work in the Nazarene regions: Africa, Asia-Pacific, Eurasia, Mesoamerica, South America, and USA/Canada. These funds enable the regions to effectively implement church planting and discipleship strategies through local churches and ministries.

Kansas District churches were very generous, giving over \$556,000 to World Evangelism Fund.. In addition, giving \$495,650.00 in Mission Specials this past church year. This includes Missionary Care, Compassionate Ministries, Child Sponsorship, JESUS Film Harvest Partners, VBS, Field Specials, Partnerships, Mission Corps, Youth in Missions, and Deputation.

Above and beyond that, our churches stepped up to the challenge of giving to our 100th Anniversary project, funding one hand pump water well for Africa. Our goal was to raise \$8,000. At convention last year, we had only raised \$2,500. I am proud to report to you that collectively, we raised \$27,557.94. That's enough for almost three and a half wells. Thank you for your generosity! Not that it's a competition, but I was quietly told that there is only one district in the country that raised more for Africa Water Wells than the Kansas District during that span.

ACTS 1:8 says, 'Be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere- in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and to the ends of the world.'

In your local president's report this year, we asked what your church had done to fulfill Acts 1:8. Jerusalem, representing your church; Judea, your community; Samaria, within the United States borders; and To the Ends of the Earth, outside of the United States. You've been busy!

The display in the foyer gives a visual of how our churches are being **Acts 1:8** churches. Many of you are ministering in your churches with the same kind of activities, yet differences too. Your reports show you are fulfilling many needs in your churches and communities. You are taking mission trips across our Nation and supporting our Global church by traveling abroad and through your generous giving.

A testimony from a new brother in Christ, Dominican Republic: "My life was very disorderly. I said many bad words and had no respect for my parents. Kids at my school had bad behavior, so I imitated those who were violent. I was abused by my parents and then became more violent. I created urban music about terrible things. I began to steal small things such as pencils and other things of my classmates. This did not make me happy; I felt a void in my heart.

I was presented the JESUS Film, which helped me recognize my need for God in my life. Today my life is different--my words are different, I am more orderly, and I have forgiven my parents. My change has been reflected in the grades that I now have at school. Now, I imitate those who love God and serve Christ. I sing to God--I am a new creature! I will continue praising God."

Kansas District Church of the Nazarene, you are part of this man's conversion. When you give to World Evangelism Fund, you help our missionaries share the Gospel of Jesus Christ and wins souls for Him.

May the Lord continue to bless us on the Kansas District as we seek His face, share His Light, be His hands and feet and go where He calls us to go.

The District Assembly Finance Committee met on May 24, 2016 at Wichita First Church of the Nazarene. Committee Members present: Rev. Jim C. Jay Bessmer; District NYI President, Rick Dages; District NMI President, Kelly Love; District Office Administrator, Angie Meinke. We, your Finance Committee, submit the following recommendations:

- 1. Budget Base:
 - a. That the base for the computation of ministry goals (i.e. budgets/apportionments) be the total money raised for all purposes for the current church year (shown as "Total Adjusted Income" on each local church's Funding the Mission church home/dashboard page).
 - b. That "income" be generally defined as any donation received by a church that qualifies as a charitable contribution.
- 2. Budget Base Calculation:
 - a. That, in keeping with the directive of the General Board, all budget apportionments be based upon total income for in the current year less the total of all monies paid for WEF and 10% Approved Specials. The percentages for WEF, P&B, MNU and DISTIRCT UNIFIED apportionments are applied to that adjusted base income. [Funding the Mission automatically calculates those apportionments when income data is provided.]
- 3. District Unified Budget:
 - a. That the apportionments for operation of the all Kansas District ministries, i.e. the District Administration and Outreach, District SDMI, and District NMI Fair Share, are combined into one District Unified Budget allocation for each church.
- 4. Apportionment goals, found on each church's Funding the Mission home/dashboard page, are computed on the base figure as follows:
 - a. World Evangelism Fund 5.5%
 - b. Pensions and Benefits Fund 2.25%
 - c. Educational Apportionment (MNU) 2.25%
 - d. District Unified Budget 6.0%
- 5. Unified District Budget Division and Disbursement:
 - a. Budget Division: That the monies paid for the District Unified Budget (6% of total adjusted income) be divided by the District Office as follows:

i.	District Operations:	85.00%
ii.	District SDMI:	10.83%
iii.	District NMI Fair Share:	04.17%

- Budget Disbursement: That the District Office remits monthly to the respective treasurers those funds designated for District SDMI, NYI and NMI Fair Share.
- 6. Newly organized churches will not be expected to pay apportionments during their first year. Thereafter, apportionments will be determined as follows: year two: 25% of calculated apportionments; year three: 50% of calculated apportionments; year four: 75% of calculated apportionments; beginning at year five the expectation will be 100% of calculated apportionments. Churches affected by this plan may give larger than prescribed percentages if they so desire, however they are required to only participate at the levels designated above.
- 7. That the 2016-2017 Unified District Budget be set at \$594,000.00 and that it be apportioned as follows:
 - A. District Administration
 - a. Salaries, Wages, Honoraria, Benefits
 - Dist. Superintendent

- 8. That all apportionments be paid on at least a monthly basis and that they be paid in full by as soon as possible after the close of the church year on April 30, 2017.
- 9. That each church utilize the "Funding the Mission" online service provided by the Global Treasury Services and the Global Stewardship Office. This helpful tool will assist in knowing the amount of each allocation goal based upon church income for each of the allocation areas: WEF, P&B, MNU, and District Unified Budget allocations.
- 10. That the district underwrites the minister's disability insurance policy for pastors and their spouses and full-time evangelists; and the district continue Workman's Compensation insurance on all district employees. (Full-time is understood as defined by the Pensions and Benefits Office at the Global Ministry Center.)
- 11. That we pay the health insurance for our district assigned personnel.
- 12. That the district superintendent and the district advisory board be empowered to draw from the interest gained on the district's capital fund account to ensure the Kansas District reaches 90% payment of all assigned ministries – utilizing matching funds from churches/individuals if possible.
- That we subsidize our children's camps with an amount specified by the DAB from interest generated by our Nazarene Foundation Investments.
- 14. That the district superintendent be granted a 30-day paid vacation at the time of his choosing.
- 15. That each church establishes a literature fund to insure that every family receives any and all magazines published by the Church of the Nazarene.
- 16. That the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board, at the time of the annual review, consider withholding or withdrawing approval of staff relationships for a church not paying its ministry goals (i.e. allocations/budgets) in full for the previous year (Manual 208.13)
- 17. That in accordance with the bylaws of our insurer, a pastor's insurance package be dropped after 31 days if the monthly premium is not received, unless a suitable explanation has been conveyed to the district office.
- 18. That the district provides each church an electronic copy of the district journal at no cost to the church.
- 19. That each church follow the *Manual* provision in paragraph 129.23 which calls for an annual audit/compilation of the financial records of the treasurer(s) of the local church.

6. Church Growth and Evangelism Committee

Our District Superintendent, Pastor Jim Bond, has given us a Vision to plant 70 new churches on the Kansas District in the next 9 years. In an effort to accomplish this goal the Committee on Church Growth and Evangelism, submits the following recommendations, understanding that each church is unique, for consideration by each local church as we strive as a district to let God use us to win as many as possible to the Lord this year. It is essential for Church Growth, Evangelism and Outreach that the Gospel message be presented during every opportunity we are given!

1. We will remind ourselves that effective church growth and evangelism will be the result of specific intercessory prayer for the lost. This should include but not be limited to praying the Luke 10:2 prayer. Therefore, each church must continuously be involved in intercessory prayer, praying for specific names whenever possible.

2. This time of prayer should be coupled with special training for the laity of our local churches in personal soul winning and lifestyle evangelism, to enable our churches to reach the lost. Local churches will have access to personnel and resources of the USA/Canada Mission/Evangelism Department, and other sources: including video training, books, tracts, and seminars on personal evangelism and lifestyle evangelism. We recommend that the District provide a resource list of those who would train others in personal evangelism.

3. We must recognize that *Effective Evangelism* is MORE than leading people to a "Spiritual Decision". We must plan for follow-up by starting New

Believers Classes, One-on-One Discipleship and other opportunities with the goal of helping them to spiritual maturity.

4. We recommend that each pastor schedule membership classes regularly, and that an Evangelism and Church membership committee be proactive in encouraging new converts to qualify for membership.

5. Each church, understanding that new classes grow faster than old ones, consider adding additional Sunday school classes or small groups, and additional or alternate Sunday school sessions, and an additional worship service, if necessary, using the resources from NPH and other sources.

6. NewStart extension ministries (revivals, Sunday Schools, etc.) be conducted in communities of people or among ethnic groups where we now do not have a Nazarene church. We especially encourage this to be done in the target cities for new Nazarene churches using the NewStart model and training from the USA/Canada Mission/Evangelism Department. These ministries must be planned with the approval of the District Superintendent.

7. Encourage every church to send both lay as well as the ministry team to Dynamic Church Planting International (DPCI) training. These training sessions will be held throughout the District to facilitate as many people as possible to attend at a minimal cost.

8. Our churches or zones consider giving assistance to our smaller churches, such as sending work teams to help improve their facilities to make them more attractive in reaching new people, or by providing financial assistance and/or workers for their evangelistic needs, or with any other labor of love to encourage and strengthen these smaller churches. Anyone who becomes aware of a church needing assistance should contact the District Superintendent and such projects be advertised in the Harvest, the District web page, and via email.

9. When church size, access, location or functional ability hinders further growth, a church should consider corrections or additions by seeking help from trained sources including, but not limited to, Nazarene building professionals and resources available from NPH.

10. Our churches strategically plan times of emphasis on both church growth and follow-up, setting specific goals to reach the lost.

11. Each church strive to develop at least one special day or event that introduces non-believers to the church, as a major outreach into the community, possibly during the Spring leading up to Easter.

12. Each local church conducts at least two revivals or Outreach weekends per year. We encourage that commissioned evangelists be used when possible or appropriate. In smaller churches where supporting a fulltime evangelist is not always possible, we encourage these churches to consider retired or neighboring pastors who have the gift of evangelism.

13. Each church presents a Christmas love offering to evangelists and song evangelists who held a meeting in their church within the last year.

14. Each church place attractive signs in strategic locations to help make the community and others more aware of the church's location, and explore and utilize other advertising means in their community, such as direct mailings, newspapers, Web- pages, television, radio, motels, and other business places. We recommend that all signs and advertising shall include the words "Church of the Nazarene."

15. This report be distributed to each congregation by creative means,

encouraging them to fulfill the great commission to reach the lost for Christ, with emphasis on the general church theme: "To Make Christlike Disciples in the Nations."

7. Education

We, the Committee on Education, submit the following report:

- 1. That the people of the Kansas District continue to pray for, support, and assist Mid-America Nazarene University, Nazarene Theological Seminary, and Nazarene Bible College and its extensions, in the great task of providing educational opportunities in a holiness environment throughout the global church as we pursue the spiritual development of God's people.
- 2. That each pastor actively support and promote these institutions by:
 - a. Scheduling a representative and/or P.R. group as available.
 - b. Serving as a local representative and recruiter.
 - c. Presenting the mission of each institution on its scheduled day of emphasis.
 - d. Announcing and publicizing all institutional activities that could relate to the local church.
- 3. That each church promotes the Annual Offerings for NBC (October) and NTS (January).
- 4. That each church sends the Education Allocation monthly.
- 5. That each church be reminded that Mid-America Nazarene University will give a 5% scholarship rebate to districts that pay 100% of their Education Allocation, and that the district treasurer be requested to include information concerning this scholarship money in his annual budget allocation letter to individual churches.
- 6. That our people as individuals support the Annual Fund that provides MNU with finances for scholarships, teachers' salaries, teaching aids, etc.
- 7. That MNU will match up to \$500.00 per student, per year, for scholarship given by each church on behalf of students who attend that church. There is no minimum amount required for the church matching scholarships. (Not dependent on the church's level of contributions through the Church of the Nazarene Education allocation system.)
- 8. That each church encourages all alumni and friends of MNU to participate in the annual Homecoming events in October.
- 9. That each local church cooperate with MNU in the following activities:
 - a. Assist with recruiting prospective students (Kansas Recruiter is Lisa Downs, 1-800-800-8887).
 - b. Encourage prospective students to attend these campus events:

SCOUT MNU Senior and Junior Visit Days

Pastor's Kids Retreat

MAX (visit <u>www.mnu.edu/admissions-events</u> for dates)

- c. Emphasize an MNU Scholarship Sunday with a cash offering for needy and deserving students.
- 10. That our people be urged to determine if their employers have an employee matching gifts educational policy that would apply to our educational institutions. If so, our people need to be encouraged to participate in these programs. These frequently untapped resources are gratis funds, and we must access and maximize usage of these benefits.
- 11. That the district newsletter, *Harvest*, and the district web page be used to the fullest extent for presenting items of interest concerning MNU, NTS, and NBC.
- 12. That pastors and parents with Nazarene young people attending non-Nazarene colleges notify respective pastors in those areas so that they may give spiritual support to these young people.
- 13. That the district NYI be commended for its MNU Kansas student appreciation activities.
- 14. That since there are so many challenges for the church's educational institutions globally, our people be urged to pray for Mid-America Nazarene University, Nazarene Theological Seminary, and Nazarene Bible College, and to focus such prayers on the students, professors, administration and staff, spiritual renewal, and annual funding.
- 15. That this report be read to each church board and/or church with copies presented to each board member.

8. Ministerial Support and Benevolence Committee

We, your committee on Ministerial Support and Benevolence, prayerfully submit the following suggestions for careful consideration by each local church:

A. Ministerial Staff and Their Families

1. That the pastors, other staff members, and their families be supported faithfully by our people with daily prayers, expressions of encouragement, and words of appreciation. Each church should plan a Staff Appreciation Day in recognition of services rendered by the staff during the previous year. The local church should encourage its pastor to set aside one day a week to enjoy personal time and rest with the family. Remember your pastor during times of pressure and stress with your prayers and concern.

2. That the churches establish an annual operating budget at the beginning of each year. The compensation of the ministerial staff should receive top priority in establishing the operating budget. The pastor's compensation should be adequate to enable the pastor to devote full time to the ministry and still support the family with dignity and respect. Salary increases should reflect a cost of living adjustment, plus additional salary increases as the church is able. The Scriptures reminds us that "the worker deserves his wages" (1 Tim 5:18) and "the laborer is worthy of his hire" (Luke 10:7). [see also 1 Cor 9:7-12]

3. Because the biblical duties of the pastor as described in Acts 6 are the "ministry of the Word and prayer" we recommend that secretarial assistance, full-time or part-time, paid or volunteer, be provided to relieve the pastor of having to perform these routine duties so he or she can devote more time to the essential pastoral work.

4. That the following vacation plan be the guide for local church boards in granting an annual vacation with full salary to their pastors.

- a. Those having served the Church of the Nazarene on this or any other district one to five years be granted a two week vacation; those serving six to ten years be granted a three week vacation; those serving longer than ten years be granted a four week vacation regardless of the tenure at the present local church.
- b. Vacation time should be free of church-related responsibility for the pulpit supply.
- c. That the pastor consider dividing the vacation into separate periods within the year, if the needs of the local church could not otherwise be served.

5. That the church provide and maintain a parsonage with utilities,

repairs, maintenance, and other related expenses paid by the church. The trustees or parsonage committee should make a semi-annual survey of the parsonage and a report be given to the church board regarding repairs and needed improvements of the parsonage. At the option of the church board the pastor may be granted the opportunity to personally purchase a home. In such situations an adequate housing allowance should be paid to the pastor on a regular monthly basis.

6. That the church board should give periodic consideration to the expense incurred by the pastor in maintaining an automobile. At the option of the church, a car may be provided by the church or a mileage allowance may be granted.

7. That an expense allowance should be given the pastor and spouse that will permit them to attend all official district gatherings. The local church is encouraged to set aside funds each year to assist the pastor and spouse (in whole or at least part) with expenses incurred in attending the General Assembly of the Church of the Nazarene. Some consideration should be given to providing financial assistance in attending general church conferences and church growth seminars.

8. That the church be aware of changing health insurance laws, and provide for the cost of health and accident insurance for the pastors and families and 100 percent of the pastor's self-employment tax. Where possible, local churches that are able should endeavor to reimburse the deductible amount that is not covered in the pastor's health insurance.

9. That each church board review the retirement benefits of its ministerial staff and seriously consider participating in the tax-sheltered annuity made available through the general church.

10. That the church board should establish a fund to be used at the pastor's discretion for continuing education and professional development.

11. Sabbaticals. Recognizing the importance and value of a sabbatical/study leave, we affirm the statement in the 2013-2017 Manual of the Church of the Nazarene (paragraph 129.10): "In order to encourage a healthy pastoral ministry and strong spiritual life of the pastor, the church board, in consultation with the district superintendent, should provide a sabbatical leave for the pastor following each seventh consecutive year of

service in one congregation. The timing and duration of the sabbatical shall be determined in consultation with the pastor, church board and district superintendent. It is strongly urged that the pastor's salary continue in full and the church board provide for pulpit supply during the sabbatical period. This topic is to be addressed by the district superintendent as part of the church/pastoral review process that would come after year two and again in year six, once the viability of continuing the relationship has been established. Materials shall be developed and distributed by the Global Clergy Development office to guide local congregations in establishing and implementing a sabbatical leave policy and procedure. At the church board's discretion, such a program may also be implemented for a member of the pastoral staff."

12. That the Board of Stewards for each local church assume responsibility of expressing appreciation materially to the ministerial staff and their families on special occasions, such as birthdays, anniversaries, Pastor Appreciation Month, Christmas, etc.

B. Evangelists and Special Workers

1. That our churches are encouraged to schedule one or two revivals each year and are strongly urged to use our full-time commissioned and registered evangelists in conducting their revivals.

2. That each church should pay the evangelist an amount at least double the pastor's weekly salary for each Sunday of the meeting, plus an amount at least 50 percent of the self-employment tax. When the evangelistic team includes a song evangelist, the church should recognize the additional financial responsibility to the song evangelist, compensating him or her in an amount commensurate with the financial commitment to the evangelist and the contribution to the revival or special services. Each church remember the evangelists of the past year and retired Nazarene ministers or widows in their congregation with a love offering at Christmas time.

3. That the church membership, in cooperation with the Board of Stewards, assume the responsibility for entertainment of evangelists and special workers.

4. That the District Advisory Board, in conjunction with the District Finance

Committee, consider underwriting the cost of the district health and accident insurance for full-time commissioned or registered evangelists and/or song evangelists who are members of the Kansas District. The District Advisory Board should annually review each evangelist receiving such assistance regarding their continuing qualification for such health insurance subsidy.

C. General

1. That all of our people will help build His kingdom by enthusiastic support to the spiritual and material needs of the church. Any church that has a repair or improvement need exceeding its financial ability should contact the district superintendent for assistance in locating volunteer work teams. This desire will be strengthened by faithful attendance at all services together with systematic giving of tithes and liberal offerings.

2. That those churches who are able should give material assistance at Christmas to other pastors and their families who are in situations of specific need. Churches should contact the district superintendent for the names of those pastors who need such assistance.

3. That each local church board should give consideration to each of these recommendations and to report to the district superintendent the actions taken by the board.

9. Christian Action Committee

The message of scriptural holiness proclaimed by the Church of the Nazarene calls God's people not only to personal piety but also to positive social influence. We believe that the most important action we must take is sharing Jesus Christ. Our Lord Jesus Christ calls us to be "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world" (Matthew 5:13-14). We should be known not simply for what we oppose, but also for the positive influence we provide as God's holy people. We are to "let our light shine before men, that they may see our good deeds and praise our Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

Believing that God wants to visit the Kansas District with a fresh outpouring of His Holy Spirit during the assembly year 2015-2016, we call upon our churches to promote specific times of prayer and intercession for our families, our church, state, nation and world.

Denominational Stance

We reaffirm the denominational stance of the Church of the Nazarene as stated in the <u>Manual</u> on the diverse social issues including entertainment, lotteries and gambling, membership in oath-bound secret orders, social dancing, the use of liquor, drugs and tobacco, hallucinogenics, stimulants, and depressants, abortion, and human sexuality. (See <u>Manual</u> par 28-32)

Social Action Resource Groups

Deserving the prayers, financial support and, when appropriate, volunteer help, are several agencies which specialize in addressing social issues in our nation and state. These groups provide reliable resources to the church, offering both information and guidance in responding wisely to current social issues. These agencies include:

- "The American Family Association" (www.afa.net, P.O. Drawer 2440, Tupelo, MS 38803), is vitally involved with eliminating moral pollution prevalent in both television and literature;
- "Focus on the Family" (P.O. Box 35500, Colorado Springs, CO 80935-3550, www.family.org, 800-232-6459), founded by Dr. James Dobson, works to promote traditional and family values through a wide range of ministries. They seek to "minister to families and individuals, and to be a resource for the church" (Focus on the Family Magazine, August 1993, p. 13). A valuable resource to keep well-informed on current social issues available through "Focus on the Family" is <u>Citizen Magazine;</u>
- "Christian Therapy and Mediation Services", (620-662-1283, 4290 N. Monroe, Hutchinson, KS 67501) is a Christian Counseling Center for a broad range of counseling needs, including mediation. Dr. Mark Glover is the director of this Christian counseling service.
- "New Creation Ministries," (316-303-2742, 3811 N. Meridian, Wichita, KS, 67204), is a Christian Help Ministry offering counseling and support for those coming out of the gay lifestyle. Clint Price is the director of the ministry.

Pastoral Leadership and "Community Impact Committees"

While we encourage our pastors and lay leaders to make their congregations aware of social issues, we realize more must be done. To effectively involve our people in addressing the social issues of the day, we encourage each church to consider forming a "Community Impact Committee." The purpose of the committee is: 1) to keep informed on social issues facing our communities, 2) to plan appropriate methods of action and 3) to assist the pastor in bringing these needs to the attention of the congregation.

Several Current Social Issues

Due to their current prominence, the following social issues deserve special mention:

Gambling -- Whereas the ill effects of gambling, such as organized crime, money laundering, prostitution, and many other unsavory vices, follow gambling operations, we adamantly oppose all gambling and any effort to expand gambling in any form in the state of Kansas including but not limited to casino gambling, lotteries, dog racing, horse racing, etc.

Abortion -- We stand opposed to induced abortion for personal convenience or population control. We also oppose the liberalizing of laws which allow induced abortion on demand. As Christians, we must not forget the rights of the unborn. Abortion is an unacceptable form of birth control. We urge our people to contact their state legislators to make known their views regarding the moral issue of abortion and to help elect individuals who support the sanctity of life. We should support unwed mothers and those in difficult pregnancies, encouraging adoption through reputable and faith-based agencies.

The Financially Impoverished and Needy -- In difficult economic times, we must be concerned about the needy of our communities. By providing food, clothing, and help on utility bills, we can continue in the footsteps of our founding fathers - that is, taking the gospel to the hurting. We encourage our people to direct gifts of support to agencies in their local communities responsible for the care of the less fortunate, such as The Salvation Army, local soup kitchens, etc. For further discussion, see paragraph 903.4 in the appendix of the Manual.

Marriage and Family Life -- Recognizing that a strong America is dependent upon a strong church, and a strong church is dependent upon strong families, we emphasize the importance of Christian family life. We continue to affirm the biblical definition of family and stand gaginst recognition of the homosexual lifestyle as a family unit. We recommend that each of our families resolve to spend time praying, reading God's Word, and worshiping together. It would be helpful if each church attempted to provide resources, books, tapes, and seminars to help train our parents to be more effective and to help our youth develop coping skills for facing peer pressure and to develop positive family dynamics during adolescence and beyond. We encourage participation in Marriage Enrichment Seminars and groups such as Promise Keepers and Heritage Keepers as tools to reinforce the sacredness of the marriage vows and health of the family. Our pastors and people must also agaressively respond to the unique ministry needs of today's single population, especially single-parent families. We strongly recommend faithful attendance in all the services of the church. Christian Therapy and Mediation Services in Hutchinson (address above) is an excellent organization for help with issues of marriage and family life.

The Sanctity of the Lord's Day -- We recommend that the Lord's Day continue to be observed as a holy day of rest, a day set aside for the worship of God and the recuperation of our bodies. We urge advanced planning to avoid Sunday purchasing.

Entertainment -- Realizing that the keen edge of our spiritual lives can easily be dulled, we admonish our people to refrain from literature and entertainment that dishonors God. President Dages declared a lunch recess at 12:02pm.

President Dages called the convention to officially convene at 1:03pm.

Secretary Stewart read Recommendations #2 & #3 from the Nominating Committee. "Mr. Chairman, the district NYI nominating committee recommends:

That in keeping with the earlier motion that the names of Jamie Johnson, Josh Moore & Larry Page be placed in nomination on the ballot for the 2016-2017 office of Vice President.

And that this election be conducted by plurality vote.

We further recommend that the names of the two non-elected individuals from the ballot for Vice-President be placed on the subsequent ballot for secretary, along with Eli Stewart's name.

And that the election of secretary should also be done by plurality.

Also, in the interest of time, we recommend that the election for age representatives be placed on the same ballot as the election for Vice President.

That the names of Caley Blosser, John VanHook, and Madlyn Dages be placed in nomination on the ballot for Middle School Representative,

That the names of Alex Page, Andrew Hall, Atalissa Hinojos, Conner Wisdom, Eli Lucas, Josh Turner, Lauren Page, and Reuben Korf be placed in nomination on the ballot for High School Representative,

That the names of Andrew Dages, Dakota White, Rachel Fitzjarrald, and Tylyn Coble be placed in nomination on the ballot for Campus / Career Representative &

Furthermore That: These representatives be elected by plurality. Laurie Coble made the motion that these recommendations be adopted. Andrew Dages seconded.

Secretary Stewart read the names of Board of Tellers #2 and had them move to the front of the room. Rick explained the vote. Ballots were distributed, votes were cast, and the Board of Tellers #2 was dismissed to count the votes.

Next, NYI Ministry Reports began. President Dages announced Lane McLain as our new MNU Admissions Counselor for Kansas. Lane showed a MNU video and shared her social media account information.

College Representatives: Andrew Dages received 37 votes, Dakota White-11, Rachel Fitzjarrald-20, and Tylyn Coble-26.

President Dages declared the election of the following:

- KNYI Vice President: Larry Page
- Middle School Representatives: Caley Blosser and Madlyn Dages
- High School Representatives: Andrew Hall, Eli Lucas, Josh Turner, and Lauren Page
- College Representatives: Andrew Dages and Tylyn Coble

For Ballot #3 (Secretary), President Dages reminded the convention of the earlier motion from Ballot # 2 that the convention passed concerning the ballot for Secretary. Secretary Stewart read the names of Board of Tellers #3 and had them move to the front of the room. President Dages explained the vote. Ballots were distributed, votes were cast, and the Board of Tellers #3 was dismissed to count the votes.

Ministry reports and updates continued. First, the district calendar was distributed and discussed. Next, for Middle School Camp, last year's camp was discussed. Eli Stewart reported that this year we are going to the Wichita Sports Forum, and that Pastor David Bond will be the speaker at camp August 1-4. For Lock-In, Greg Sharpes announced the Lock-In dates of November 4-5. He also shared that last year's lock-in had almost 500 students and adults attend. Pastor Jim led the group in a Prayer of Installation, and blessings for the group for the upcoming year.

Andrew Rankin made a motion to authorize the Recording Secretary to edit minutes in preparation

B. NMI Convention

Proceedings Monday July 11, 2016

The 95th annual Kansas NMI Convention was opened with greetings Rev. Amy Foster. She opened with a scripture reading from Romans 12.

Kelly Love called to order the 95th Kansas District NMI Convention welcoming our District Superintendent, Rev Jim Bond, our visitors, and especially our special speakers, Dr. Scott Rainey.

Kelly asked NMI secretary, Jonette Anderson, to set the time of the meeting and read the convention appointments.

Secretary Jonette Anderson made the motion to set the Convention time to be from 8:30 am to 12:00 noon; the voting area to be established as the first 15 rows, the platform and the sound booth area; the pages to be Pastor Rich Humphrey, Chance Henson & Billy Byler; recording secretary to be Kim Easdon; election secretary to be Pastor Scott Powell and that the special order of the day be set for 8:40 am.
